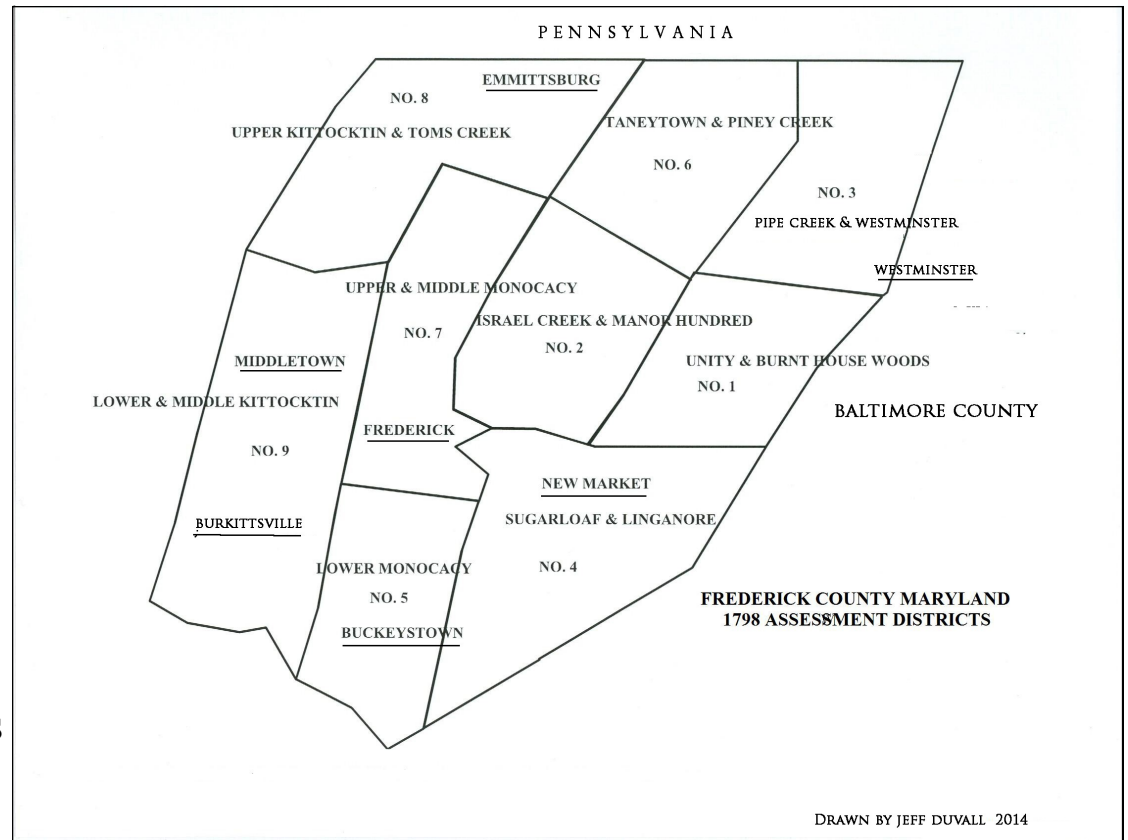

- DISTRICT-4 SUGARLOAF & LINGANORE HUNDREDS
(Lots in New Market)
- DISTRICT-5 LOWER MONOCACY HUNDRED
(Lots in Frederick Town)
- DISTRICT-6 TANEY TOWN & PINEY CREEK HUNDREDS
(Lots in Taney Town)
- DISTRICT-7 UPPER & MIDDLE MONOCACY HUNDREDS
(Lots in Cregers Town and Graceham)
- DISTRICT-8 UPPER KITTOCKTIN & TOMS CREEK HUNDREDS
(Lots in Emmittsburgh)
- DISTRICT-9 LOWER & MIDDLE KITTOCKTON HUNDREDS
(Lots in Middle Town, New Town & Berlin Town)



Several of the eastern hundreds in Frederick County became part of Carroll County in 1837 and some of Baltimore County's western hundreds were also incorporated into Carroll County at the same time.

* A "hundred" was a geographic term originally referring to an area which encompassed about 100 homesteads and/or could raise 100 armed men. It was used in England and some parts of the United States.
